

ADOPTION OF VILLAGE

Adoption of villages: The College has implemented “Adopted Village Scheme” which is distinctive to vision priority and thrust. Maximum students of the college are from nearby villages. Most of the students are from economically weaker, socially downtrodden families. The parents and guardians of the students are illiterate farmers, labours working at farm and elsewhere. In order to directly focus on the social and sustainable issues, the college has adopted 1 village named "Mallakholi" in the year 2019, located near Someshwar which have a population of around 1145. Agriculture is the one of the most important component of Indian economy. The current situation of Indian villages is very poor. Villages are facing a number of problems, such as education, crop prices, pure potable water, sanitation etc. Hence, our college has adopted this village. College carries out various activities like creating awareness about health issues, Yoga camps and Cleanliness drives, has also been repeatedly carried out by the college.

Objective of the scheme:

- To sensitise the villagers about cleanliness, hygiene, environment protection, and climate change.
- To suggest alternative ways for income.
- To aware villagers about socio-economic developments.
- To support them to get the benefits of government policies.

Practice:

At the beginning of every academic year the head of the committee prepare the annual action plan and submit it to the principle and sarpanch of that village .As per planning generally following programmes are organized in the adopted villages

- 1) Tree Plantation
- 2) Cleanliness Drive
- 3) Eradication of plastic
- 4) Rallies related to voting right, awareness of education etc.

At the end of the session feedback is taken from the pradhan and finally the report is submitted to the principal of college.

Evidence of Success:

The programmes conducted in adopted villages created awareness among the villages regarding cleanliness, environment protection and hygiene.
